It was an education to see our images judged as they would be at an external competition, i.e. there can be only one gold, one silver and one bronze and Mark explained the distinctions very well. In the Advanced Section, Marie Agnew's colour image "Time to Think" was awarded 'Gold' with a very worthy 20 points. In the Senior Section, Tony McDonnell's mono image "Not a Happy Camper" received 20 points whilst in the colour section; Denis Whelehan's image "Refreshment" was awarded a well-deserved 20 points.

Mark struggled to pick an Image of the Month from these 3 but the bragging rights went to Tony for "Not a Happy Camper". Congratulations to Tony and indeed to everyone who participated in this month's competitions.
